According to church records, the Doubs United Methodist Church originally named the Smith's Chapel, was built in 1879 on land donated by William Smith, a local entrepreneur.

The Doubs United Methodist Church is a gable roofed one and one-half story frame church. The building is a "T" shape with a two story bell tower.

The chapel bell is set in the tower through four Gothic openings with a short turned railing. Simple brackets support the slate pyramidal roof with decorative fishscale shingles.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Doubs United Methodist Church is a gable roofed one and one-half story frame church which faces east from the west side of Doubs Road in Doubs. The building is a "T" shape with a two story bell tower. The principle facade, which is built in three sections, is five bays wide.

The main entrance, three paneled twin doors with a stained glass triangular transom, is located in the fourth bay which is the bell tower. Lettering in the transom indicates "Doubs Methodist Church".

The chapel bell is set in the tower through four Gothic openings with a short turned railing. Simple brackets support the slate pyramidal roof with decorative fishscale shingles.

A small shed roofed, one bay wide, frame addition extends south of the tower.

The north section of the building is one bay wide with a large Gothic stained glass window centered on the first level. A segmented semicircular window is located in the gable.

The south section of the church is two bays by three bays wide. Stationary stained glass Gothic casement windows with arched wood entablatures occupy each bay.

The entire structure is covered by a standing seam tin gable roof with a boxed cornice and return. A small brick chimney rises in the southwest corner of the building.

The south section of the building is constructed on a cinder block foundation; the north section is built on a low stuccoed random stone foundation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Doubs United Methodist Church

According to church records, the Doubs United Methodist Church originally named the Smith's Chapel, was built in 1879 on land donated by William Smith, a local entrepreneur. The church was incorporated on September 15, 1879 in the Frederick County Corporation Records and made the following entry.

"The members of the Smith's Chapel Congregation Buckeystown Circuit, Methodist Episcopal Church did in pursuance of a notice given on the preceding Sabbath by the Reverend Reuben Kolb, preacher in charge of . . . Smith's Chapel Congregation assemble at the Calico Rocks Public School House being the place ordinarily used for the meetings of said congregation and did then elect George W. Copeland, James D. Hood, Charles W. Myers and William Smith who . . . with the minister shall act as trustees . . ."1

The church will be celebrating its centennial this year.




